Formation of the Health Professions Advisors of North Carolina (HPANC)

The Health Professions Advisors of North Carolina had its origin at a meeting at East Carolina University School of Medicine on March 12-13, 1993. The meeting, organized by Associate Dean of Admissions, Dr. Dean Hayek, brought advisors to the medical school to discuss the Generalist Physician Program. In a round table discussion toward the end of the meeting, Dr. Wayne Ayers suggested that North Carolina health professions advisors needed an independent organization that would provide a forum for information sharing and collegiality. There was general agreement among the advisors. Dr. Ayers suggested forming such an organization, and Dr. Jeremiah Putnam of Davidson College volunteered to lead this group along with the assistance of Dr. Hugo Lane of Wake Forest University. During the following year, Drs. Putnam and Lane worked to develop a program for advisors that became the inaugural meeting of what would become the Health Profession Advisors of North Carolina. Dr. Hayek hosted the inaugural gathering on March 12, 1994.

After this successful meeting, Drs. Putnam and Lane recognized the need to determine advisor interested in developing further a more formal health professions organization. Dr. Putnam sent a questionnaire to determine advisor interest and asked for a \$20.00 contribution to establish a budget. Dr. Lane acted as the treasurer, collecting funds from advisors who would become charter members of HPANC.

The President served as Program Chair and the Vice President collected funds generated by the meeting which were sent to the Treasurer. The HPANC Newsletter was inaugurated and published for several years. Additionally, goals were developed for HPANC.

HPANC Goals:

- To facilitate the exchange of ideas among North Carolina advisors
- To facilitate dialog between North Carolina advisors and professional school
- To provide leadership in addressing problems related to professional school advising
- To plan yearly meetings of North Carolina health professions advisors and professional school directors
- To publish a newsletter biannually
- To assist health professions advisors with special projects

In 1999, the Constitution and Bylaws of the Health Professions Advisors of North Carolina were written by Drs. Putnam and Lane and approved by the membership. A year later, and with the significant help of Dr. Lane, HPANC was incorporated in the State of North Carolina with an SOSID Number of 0550348.
